ENTRANCE EXAM INFORMTION

Several universities use admissions tests as part of the selection process. You have to register online to sit these tests. The tests are very demanding, so make sure you research them in good time and prepare for them. Speak to your guidance teacher if you need any help to do this. We can arrange for some admissions tests to be completed at other education centres. <u>UCAT</u> (previously known as UKCAT) is used by **all Scottish Medical and Dental Schools** as well as many English Universities – check online at www.ucat.ac.uk -> UCAT -> Universities, to see which ones.

Please note: UCAT registration and online booking opened on 1 July 2020 and closes on 17 September 2020. You need to book your test on the UCAT website with the last testing date being the 1^{st} October 2020. It costs £75. Please consult the UCAT website where there is a huge amount of information, as well as practice tests, question banks, tutorials and guides/plans.

<u>BMAT</u> is used for entry to <u>Medicine</u> and <u>Biomedical Sciences</u> at <u>Oxford</u>, <u>Cambridge</u> and <u>another few English Universities</u> - check online at <u>www.admissionstesting.org/for-test-takers/bmat/bmat-october</u> to see which ones. Registration opens on 1st September 2020 until 15th October 2020 with the assessment taking place on 3rd/4th November 2020.

<u>LNAT</u> is used by Oxford and also by Glasgow University for entry to Law, as well as a few other universities - check online at www.lnat.ac.uk/what-is-lnat/do-i-need-to-sit-the-test to see which ones. The LNAT website also gives information about registration and assessment dates. https://lnat.ac.uk/registration/dates-and-deadlines/

<u>PAT</u> is used by Oxford for entry to Physics, Physics and Philosophy, Materials Science and any Engineering Science courses. You need to register for this by 15 October 2020 with the assessment taking place on 5th November 2020.

<u>ENGAA</u> is used by **Cambridge** for entry to **Engineering** and **Chemical Engineering via Engineering**. You need to register for this by 15 October 2020 with the assessment taking place on 5th November 2020.

<u>MAT</u> is used by Oxford and Imperial College London for entry to many Mathematics and Computing Science courses - check online at www.admissionstesting.org/Images/302039-courses-requiring-mat.pdf to see which courses require this assessment. You need to register for this by 15 October 2020 with the assessment taking place on 4th November 2020.
