Universal Supports

To provide a learning environment where every young person is happy, safe and achieving their potential

Pupil's needs are met by classroom supports such as

Printed notes, seating position in the classroom, use of ICT where appropriate, individual targets, frequent teacher check-ins



Targeted Support

Guidance support monitoring meetings

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Pupil Support Group with educational psychology

Follow up supports – time in a support for pupil's class, time out card, wellbeing group, wellbeing one-to-one, literacy supports, numeracy supports



Alternative Assessment Arrangements

To provide a learning environment where every young person is happy, safe and achieving their potential



Pupils with ASN may do their assessments in support for pupils to allow them access to ICT, electronic reader/reader pen, extra time, quiet room as appropriate



Teachers should discuss what may be required in advance of the assessment and book them into support for pupils
