The school roll started at 1390 but as is customary it settles down as some senior pupils leave for college, employment or to university through clearing and we now have 1367 pupils so the school is still exceptionally busy.

SQA Results

We have had another strong set of SQA results this year from our pupils in S4-6. In S4 there was a slight drop in overall performance but the results remain very positive. This is in line with the national picture and the picture across East Dunbartonshire. S4 pupils across the country were the ones most impacted upon by COVID lockdown and restrictions in the sense that they lost a lot of the fundamental building blocks in S1 and S2 to help prepare them for the Senior Phase when they missed the four months at the end of S1 and had a fragmented experience across S2 and part of S3. This meant that their S4 experience was always going to be challenging.

On a more positive note we had one of the best sets of H Grade results from our S5 cohort over the past 12 years so we were very pleased with their performance, whilst our S6 pupils performed in line with expectations. Well done to all of our Senior Phase pupils on their performance. The 119 pupils who applied to university almost all gained the necessary grades for the courses they had applied for, which is highly positive.

The Presentation of awards event took place in the assembly hall. There were over 100 friends and family watching 65 pupils gain various awards.




There was a musical interlude where Evans from S6 played a fantastic piece on his violin.

Senior Phase Partnership Programme and Foundation Apprenticeships

Each session Lenzie Academy takes part in East Dunbartonshire's Senior Phase Partnership Programme. The programme offers young people a wide range of vocational options at varying levels via our college partners. In addition to this, students who have applied for a Foundation Apprenticeship spend 2 days out of school with their time split between college and later in the session, a work placement. These courses are accredited by the SQA and provide young people with the skills, knowledge and experience specific to the option subject and industry sector it represents.

Across S5/6 and both programmes we have over 40 students involved this session, enhancing the experience and opportunities of our school community.

MCR Pathways

We are the first school in East Dunbartonshire to have the new programme MCR Pathways running. Our MCR Pathway Co-ordinator, Claire, is here to promote Motivation, Resilience and Commitment in our pupils through a variety of fun and innovative methods and provide a friendly face around the school. We are excited to expand this in the months to come



Coaching Academy

Mr Smylie is starting a coaching academy for Senior pupils who are interested in building their leadership skills through sport.

The academy is an interactive course that will run after school for 8-weeks, teaching pupils the basics of coaching and giving them the opportunity to put into practice what they have learned by leading small parts of sessions.

Pupils will have the opportunity to lead after-school clubs within Lenzie Academy or in feeder primary schools once they have completed the course.

Spaces are already limited, so any pupils interested should see Mr. Smylie in the PE department as soon as possible.

Developing the Young Workforce 2023 – 2024

Developing the Young Workforce (DYW) works to ensure that all young people at Lenzie Academy have a work relevant educational experience. The DYW department aims to bridge the gap between the world of work and school. Miss Gibbons (PT of DYW) and Mr McClune (Deputy Head in charge of DYW) have organised a range of events this year to support the young people at Lenzie Academy and offer them a wide variety of exciting opportunities.

Already this year, our senior students have been offered the chance to apply for a work insight week with Morgan Stanley and participate in an event called 'Step into Finance' at Strathclyde University. We also have a range of opportunities coming up including a 'Step into Stem' event, an upcoming partnership with AG Barr and the opportunity to attend a Q and A with a civil engineer. We ask that all pupils monitor the DYW section of their Teams page for regular updates and new opportunities.

We can also announce that we will be having a 'DYW Pathways' event for the pupils, parents and carers of S3 to S6. You will have the opportunity to hear about the different options that are available on leaving school be that an apprenticeship, job, college course or university course. There will also be a variety of local employers there to discuss routes into their career and to offer students and parents/carers advice for how to achieve their goals. This will be taking place on the 15th of February 2024.
