



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Entrance requirements terminology

- **Standard** – typically an offer could be made
- **Adjusted/Minimum** - the lowest grades they would consider
- **Widening Access** – the grades required if you fall under certain criteria that put you at a disadvantage already
- Different information/language used in each university
- S5 entry requirements differ from S6

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Personal Statement

Usually Focuses on one subject area and mentions this

Supplements academic credentials

Show your interest in the subject – main focus

Demonstrates “super curricular” interest

Makes you stand out

Is crucially important

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Deadlines

Early Applications

- **11th Sept** Personal Statement deadline
- **26 September** on-line form completed
- **26-29 September** 1-1 Guidance interviews
- **6 October** – last day for GT to submit paperwork to head teacher

Regular Applications

- **29 September** Personal Statement drafts to GTs
- **Oct/Nov** 1-1 Guidance interviews
- **1 November** on-line form completed
- **1 December** Guidance interviews complete
- **8 December** Last day for student to review/submit pay/send
- **11 December** Last day for GT to submit paperwork to head teacher

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Support Moving Forward

- Hand in personal statement
- Pupils meet 1-1 with their guidance teacher to ensure form is accurate and as strong as can be
- Pupil makes final corrections
- Pupil review and submit (pay/send) form – this comes to school
- Guidance teacher writes reference
- Mr Paterson reviews application and reference
- Office staff do final clerical check, verified and send form to UCAS – a month ahead of national deadline

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Interview/Supplementary Testing

- Many courses now interview
- Mock interviews available – see Miss Munro to arrange
- Supplementary tests eg LNAT, UCAT ... or a portfolio may be required. Research is important.

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Offers

- Some offers will come in very quickly
- **All applications made by the course deadline (25th Jan) will be given equal consideration**
- Potential worries about not getting an offer – **places are not allocated on a first come first served basis**
- When offers are in, they need to make a decision around the start of June

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What Can You Do to Support your Young Person

- Ensure your YP continues to work hard in S6
- Provide guidance with choices of subject
- Assist with the research process
- Log on to UCAS with them to see the application
- Ensure they adhere to timeline and deadlines
- Ensure any required voluntary placements are completed
- Read personal statement before it is submitted
- Ensure this process is one of their priority
