2 Minutes of Previous AGM

The minutes from the previous Annual General Meeting held on Monday 10th October 2022 were noted and accepted as read.

3 Chairperson's Report

Mrs White outlined the role of the Lenzie Academy Parent Council. She advised that the Constitution and other related documents were posted on the school's website and were available for anyone who wishes to read them.

Mrs White reported on matters that had arisen from a recent Parent Council Forum where many of the usual generic issues were discussed as well as some additional funding issues.

SQA Results 2023

S4

- Fall in % of 5+ N5 to 64% (average tends to be 70%).
- Fall in S4 is across EDC schools and nationally.
- Insight data demonstrates that the school are 12% above of what is called the 'virtual comparators' (64% v 52%).

S5

- Strong performance with 46% achieving 5+ H Grades.
- Outside of COVID years this was the best results Lenzie Academy has ever had.
- Insight data demonstrates that the school are 16% ahead of the 'virtual comparators' (46% v 30%).

S6

- Strong performance with 69% achieving 5+ H Grades.
- Insight data shows the school are 16% above the 'virtual comparator' score (69% v 53%)
- 1+ AH grade was 5% above the virtual comparator (45% v 40%)

SQA Results

Comparison with other EDC schools

S4

- Across all N5 subjects LA were in 1st to 4th place in 19/26 of all N5s
- Across all N5 subjects LA were in 1st or 2nd place in 12/26 subjects

S5/6 H Grade

- Across all H Grade subjects LA were placed 1st to 4th in 19/28 of all H Grades.
- Across all H Grade subjects LA were placed 1st or 2nd in 15/28 of all H Grades.

Hayward Review

Mr Paterson offered an update on the Hayward Review, an independent review of Qualifications and Assessment that was announced by the Scottish Government in October 2021. He offered some background context and was able to highlight some of the main recommendations.

East Dunbartonshire Council - Quality Review

This will take place between Monday 30 October and Thursday 2 November. A team of eight people will engage with the school:

- three Council Officers
- two Head Teachers
- three Deputy Head Teachers

from different schools across East Dunbartonshire.

The Quality Review will consist of a series of class visits; focus groups; individual interviews and a review of documentation. There will also be pre-visit surveys of teachers, support staff, pupils, parents/carers and school partners.

Education Scotland Inspection

It is thought that this will be completed at some point during this current academic year.

Carol Nurbhai intimated that she was willing to undertake the roll of Clerk going forward. No other nominations for these positions were received so both were confirmed in these roles for a further year.
