



Welcome to the latest newsletter, which covers the months of April and May. April is when our senior pupils in S4, S5 and S6 go on SQA study leave. This allows staff within the school to engage as SQA markers, verifiers and setters. Many of our teachers work in various positions with the SQA and they have to go out to various meetings prior to marking SQA scripts. It also allows the school to engage in other activities that we could not normally do due to class cover arrangements.

We had a number of trips scheduled for SQA study leave time both local and to other parts of the world. We engaged in lots of curricular enrichment activities during this time. We introduced our S1 pupils to a Bounce back day, which aims to promote resilience and help them with strategies to overcome challenges they may face. Our S2 participated in our annual Science Fair and our S3 pupils engage in their electives and work on the Youth Philanthropy Initiative (YPI). Through YPI, all pupils engage with charities and find out about what work they do and how they positively influence their chosen cause as well as wider society. As well as all of this, we have prepared for the new timetable, which started on Monday 2 June.

Across April and May we said goodbye to our S6 pupils as they leave for employment, college or university. On Thursday 24 May we spent a wonderful last day with our S6 pupils. It was such a pleasure to see 180 young people enjoy their last day. I don't think I've ever signed so many school shirts. Their final event as a year group was their graduation on Friday 30 May at 5.30pm where all the young people, dressed for their Prom and joined by their parents/carers arrived at the school for a brief reception and thereafter we went on to the Westerwood Hotel for their Prom. It was a lovely evening and an excellent way for staff within the school to bid farewell to an excellent year group. More than 30 staff attended the Prom, a testament to the high regard in which this year's S6 is held.

In May we also had our P7 Induction days so as we bid farewell to our S6 pupils we also welcomed next year's S1 pupils. These induction days are the culmination of many short visits that happen across Primary 6 and particularly Primary 7. We welcomed nearly 240 young people on Wednesday 21 May and Thursday 22 May. All pupils got to spend time with their guidance teachers and followed a secondary timetable for two days – getting used to a new environment and moving to different locations within the building after every period. Our S3 mentors acted as guides to our P7 pupils and they will do so again when the young people arrive in August. In May we had a visit from a number of staff from Perth High School who were keen to engage with us in light of our recent experience of an Education Scotland inspection. In total 10 staff came down for the day to engage with many of our staff to discuss learning and teaching approaches, curricular structures and a wide variety of other areas. They will be moving into a new school in August 2025 and they have invited us up to have a look around their new building, which will be helpful to us when engaging with the local authority and the nominated contractor.

As I write this insert we are beginning our new timetable and we expect the month of June to be a busy and productive month.

Promethean boards

In May, the school received a much needed boost to our IT provision through the installation of Promethean Plasma TVs in all classrooms, labs, kitchens and workshops. This will enhance the quality of learning and teaching across the school and staff have been trained on the functionality of the new resources for their classrooms.

SLT visits to BGE Academies

In May, senior leaders visited a wide array of S1 BGE Academy classes to observe the learning and teaching going on. There are six BGE Academies running across the school – Digital Academy, STEM Academy, Creativity Academy, Citizenship Academy, Skills Academy and Wellbeing Academy. It was delightful to observe the young people so engaged and motivated in their learning. The BGE Academies programme will roll into S2 for session 2025-26 and we expect the quality of provision to be as high quality as the S1 programme.

Senior Phase Prize Giving

On Wednesday 28 May we held our Senior Phase Prize Giving within the school to recognise the contribution of S4-6 pupils in both their curricular subject areas and also for wider school involvements. This is one of four Prize Giving events that happen around this time of year. In early June, we will hold our BGE Prize Giving and our Sports Prize Giving whilst in August we will hold our Celebration of Character Evening to recognise the contribution of many of our young people who assist in the local community and are accredited with Saltire Awards and Dynamic Youth Awards.



School Trips

S2 Geography trip

Our class was studying the 'Earth Forces' topic, looking at natural disasters and the science behind earthquakes and volcanoes. As part of our studies we visited Dynamic Earth and Arthur's Seat. Going out and learning about a topic is different than just learning about it in a classroom and that was beneficial because it helped us to learn in a fun way.



The trip was an amazing experience, especially in Dynamic Earth because of the interesting interactive environment. Such as an earthquake room, where we experienced how an earthquake could potentially feel like in real life and the ice age room where we got to touch a pretend glacier. Climbing up Arthur's Seat was a long journey but it was all worth it at the end because of the stunning views of the City of Edinburgh. Overall we had a blast at Dynamic Earth and Arthur's Seat, it shows different ways on how the earth is changing.

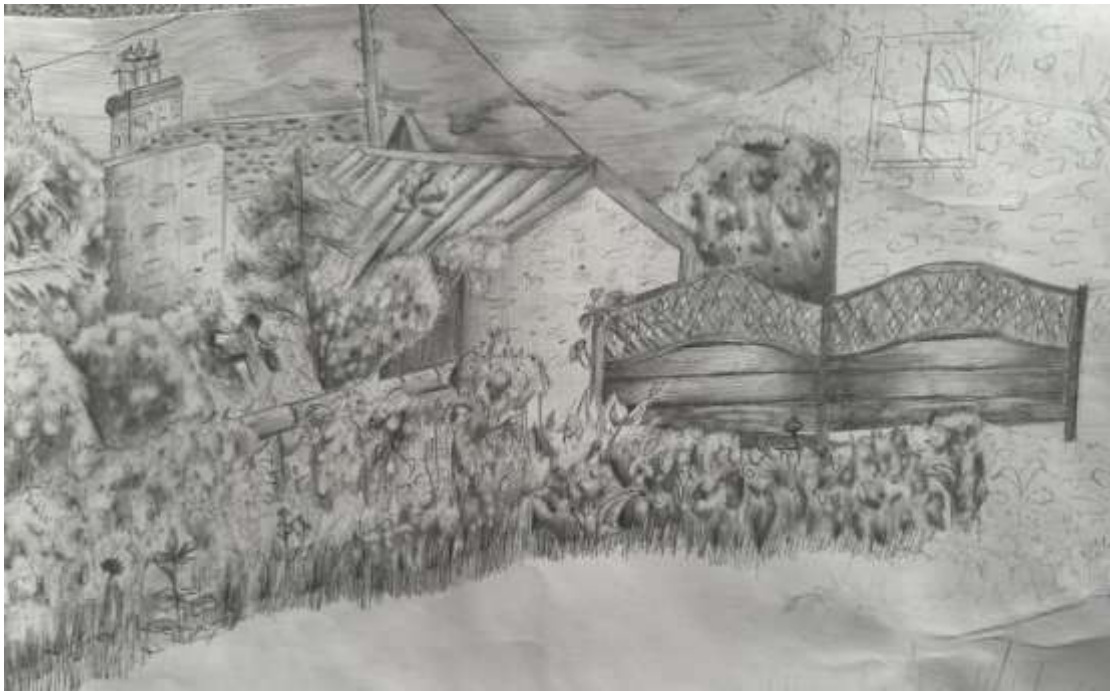

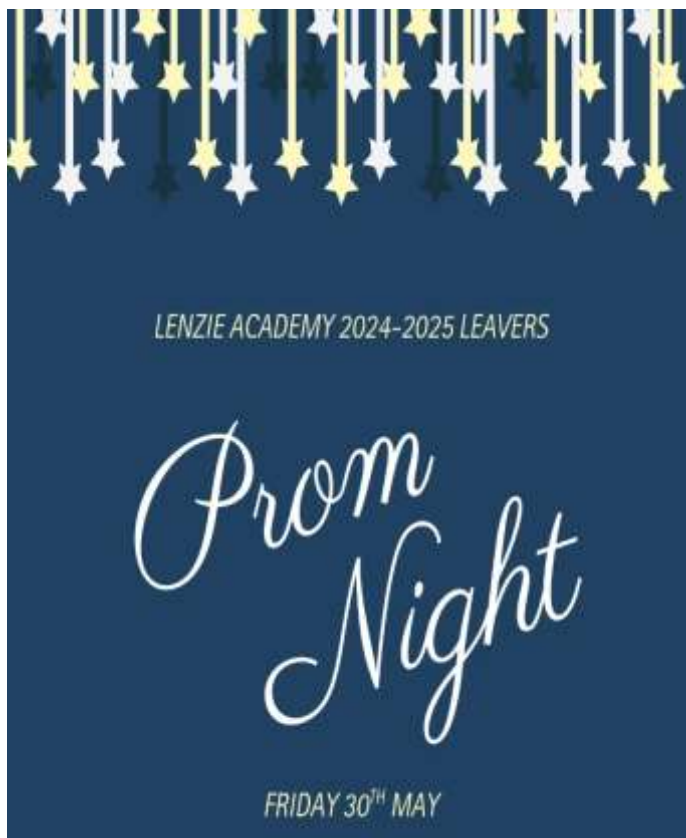


S6 Last day
