Welcome to our last newsletter of the session. It has been another hectic year with a huge number of positive events going on across the school. The year that has just passed was also one where the months of October and November were challenging due to the preparations for an HMIe Inspection in October; the inspection itself in November and the ongoing engagement with the inspectors in December and January.

The month of June has been very busy, as the content of this newsletter will demonstrate, and all staff and pupils are looking forward to a well-deserved break. June is traditionally when we start on our new timetable for session 2025-26 and valuable work is undertaken during those important three weeks in June. It is also when we have our prize giving events and a lot of curricular departments run trips and various activities.

On 3 June we had our P7 Information Evening for parents/carers as a follow up to our two P7 induction days in May. This year's event was well attended and led by Mr McClune (DHT for S1) and Mrs Lennox (PT Support for Pupils) who took parents/carers through a comprehensive overview of what S1 will look like for our pupils. We also had two S1 pupils who spoke very well about their first year as pupils within the school.

In June, we had a variety of public engagement meetings related to the construction of the new school, led by the EDC Major Assets team. They met with pupils and staff on the afternoon of Tuesday 10 June followed by an evening session with the chairs of the parent councils of all schools affected. The following evening there was a session for local community councils in the Marina and then on Thursday 12 June an open drop in session, for any interested member of the public, in Lenzie Academy from 4.00pm – 8.00pm, which was well attended.

As a school we continue to engage with contractors in relation to various internal design features of the new school. On 17 June we discussed internal and external doors and security features. This liaison will continue as we progress with the new school's design.

The month of June is always a busy month in terms of staffing. We have had a number of interviews for various posts within the school. Ms Warnock was appointed PT Physics in June and we have interviews for various posts ongoing currently in Business Education, Computing Science, English and for some PEF posts.

As we prepare for the new session, I wanted to remind all parents/carers about SQA results day. Pupils will receive their SQA results on Tuesday 5 August. Members of the Senior Leadership Team will be in school on Wednesday 6 August from 10.00am – 12.00pm should any young person wish to re-negotiate their options in light of their SQA results. Please phone the school office and arrange an appointment time should this affect your child. Young people can also wait until they come back to school to speak to their year head. Information relating to appeals – urgent and non-urgent has been sent to all parents/carers and there is also information on the year group Teams pages relating to procedures and dates for appeals.

On behalf of all staff within the school I want to thank all parents/carers for their support throughout the year, it is much appreciated. We hope you all have a lovely summer break and we look forward to welcoming all of our young people back to school on Thursday 14 August at 08.45am.

### S4 Geography - Loch Lomond Field Trip

All of our S4 Geography pupils recently took part in a fieldwork trip to Loch Lomond, where they investigated glaciated landscapes and land use conflicts — key elements of their course. While the weather was typically Scottish (changeable, to say the least!), spirits remained high as pupils embraced the chance to experience Geography in action.

The day began in Balmaha, where the Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park Ranger Service gave a valuable insight into how the park manages the pressures of tourism. Pupils then enjoyed a short walk to Craigie Fort, where they completed field sketches of the impressive glacial scenery and made real-world connections to what they've been learning in class.

A key part of their fieldwork involved interviewing visitors to the area. Despite some initial nerves, pupils showed great confidence in gathering information from tourists from as far afield as Germany, Austria, Hungary, and the Czech Republic — as well as from across the UK.

In the afternoon, the group travelled to Loch Lomond Shores in Balloch. Here, pupils explored a classic honeypot site and conducted further interviews, all while observing how tourism is managed in a high-traffic area. A great hands-on learning experience that brought classroom theory to life — and, judging by the sleepy faces on the return journey, a busy day for all involved!





#### NYC trip

We're excited to share highlights from our recent school trip to New York City, where 50 pupils experienced a week packed with history, culture, and unforgettable memories from Monday 9th to Saturday 14th June. We departed Glasgow on Monday morning all kitted out in our New York jumpers personalised by our very own crafty pupils with the help of Ms Forrest. We flew via Reykjavik before landing at Newark International Airport in the evening where we stayed at the West Side YMCA, ideally located for exploring Manhattan.

On Day two the day began with a hearty breakfast at Old John's, followed by a brief visit to Times Square to soak up the atmosphere - just before a sudden downpour caught the group by surprise! It was then a soggy trip to Battery Park and a ferry ride to the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. Pupils had the opportunity to learn about immigration and the symbolic meaning of Lady Liberty. In the afternoon, we visited the 9/11 Memorial Museum, where we engaged thoughtfully with the exhibits, reflecting on one of the most significant events in modern history, an emotional day for some. We had dinner at Dallas BBQ followed by an evening stroll through the vibrant city with a stop for some TikTok famous Crumbl cookies. It was a 30K step kind of day.

On Day three we walked through Wall Street with soaring Views After breakfast. Pupils headed downtown for a guided walking tour of the Financial District, led by local experts John Gallagher and Joey Hannah. Highlights included Wall Street, the New York Stock Exchange, Trinity Church, Chinatown, Little Italy and the iconic Charging Bull. Some pupils stepped out their comfort zone and tried some famous dumplings in Chinatown. The afternoon offered free time to explore Chelsea Market and the High Line, a unique urban park built on a historic freight rail line. We had dinner at Sbarro, followed by an evening visit to the Empire State Building, where students enjoyed breath-taking views of the New York skyline under the stars. This was a top highlight for most. We hit the 30K step count again today!

On Day four we took in iconic Sights & Broadway Lights. The group were excited to get some free time to explore Times Square, where they shopped until they dropped. Some of us took this as an opportunity to sneak another view at Summit One Vanderbilt, others couldn't wait to try out some friend chicken at Raising Caine's. Next was a quick meeting point in Bryant Park, an ice cream stop and a wander around Grand Central Terminal, soaking in the vibrant atmosphere. In the afternoon, we visited the Top of the Rock at Rockefeller Centre, taking in panoramic views from one of the city's most famous rooftops. After dinner at the Hard Rock Café, the day concluded with a magical performance of Disney's Aladdin on Broadway – a true highlight for many! We made it three days in a row at 30K steps.

On day five we enjoyed a wander around Central Park before heading to a behind-the-scenes tour of Macy's, one of the world's largest department stores. Pupils were itching to wander the store to see what goodies they could buy. After some final free time and lunch, the group collected their luggage and made their way to the



airport for their return journey. Everyone was happily exhausted and ready to rest their feet after several action-packed days exploring the city.

We arrived back in Glasgow, tired but thrilled with all we had seen and learned. We are incredibly proud of how our pupils conducted themselves throughout the trip and we hope they have gained some memories to last a lifetime.
















### Women into Engineering

The lecture theatre in the Royal College Building was full of pupils from 13 local authorities from the West of Scotland and 5 of those successful entries were from Lenzie Academy.

Congratulations to Avani, Peace and Nneoma who secured Bronze awards in the Middle Division along with Glorious who gained Bronze in the Junior Division and Sriram who achieved Silver in the Junior Division. Pupils were praised for their perseverance in pursuing unfamiliar lines of thought in mathematical and logical reasoning.

Well done to all our pupils who submitted entries but did not receive an award. Pupils volunteer to take part in this annual competition, taking time out of their busy schedules to attempt the not so easy questions! Next year the Scottish Mathematical Challenge celebrates its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the SMC are promising gold mugs for all Gold and Silver awards! ### S3 Elective Programme

The S3 Elective Programme started on the 28th of April and ran through to the 30<sup>th</sup> of May. It has been another successful year and the staff and pupil feedback has been very positive.

We had a few new additions to the programme this year; LA Fit and Beyond Ready Meals. We had a smaller group of pupils complete the Duke Of Edinburgh elective but this has given them the opportunity to get a head start on achieving their certification.

Pupils learned how to make different types of coffees in the Barista elective and staff got the benefit of being the taste testers. Those pupils taking part in the Sports Leader class got the opportunity to take on a lead role at the Lenzie Meadow and Lairdsland Sports days. The Beyond Ready meals classes (all 80 of them) enjoyed learning about to cook different more healthy versions of ready meals this included, burgers, pizzas, loaded fries and smoothies.

The programme has been a great success with pupils having the chance to enjoy the local bike track, the sunshine we had in May made this even more enjoyable. We also had a group of pupils learning conversational German and learning about German culture. LA Fit provided the chance for pupils to be guided by staff on how to use the gym equipment, the feedback has been very positive and this will be offered again next session.

In Criminology pupils got the opportunity to learn about crime scenes and think about the different perspectives of a case. Art printmaking gave pupils the opportunity to experiment with different materials. In Media pupils were studying how the media can portray people in different ways in order to create victims and villains. GarageBand was used in Music Technology to create tracks.

The judges had a very hard time deciding on the final winners, but Glasgow Samaritans were awarded the cheque for £3000.

One of the 5 finalists in this year's YPI challenge were supporting a charity that have not been to Lenzie Academy before – Sporting Memories is a collective that supports older men and tackles both physical and mental health issues. The four boys who represented them on the night fully admitted that they had not really seen the point of taking part in YPI until they engaged with their charity and then they began to think about what their lives might be like in the future. Although they did not win, the charity were very keen to invite them to one of their weekly sessions so on 23rd June the team went to St Columba's church hall in Kirkintilloch and took part in games of walking football and then the talking about sport
