

Remember to write in sentences and paragraphs and check your spelling.



This task asks you to write in role as one of the characters from the Yeh Shen story. You must imagine how it would feel to be them and write as if you are them.

Exemplar

Dear Diary, today my stepmother made me clean all of the house. When I finished she said it wasn't clean enough she made me do it again! I am so exhausted and upset.

If you are struggling to remember the characters you can read the story on the next page - this will help you to better understand the characters.

During the time of the Qin and Han dynasties, a cave chief named Wu married two wives and each gave birth to baby girls. Before long Chief Wu and one wife died leaving one baby, Yeh Shen, to be raised by her stepmother.

For questions 9&10 pupils are asked to choose a character who fits the described voice. The voice terms in the table below may help to answer the question.


Voice Terminology


Tone	A change in the voice to express emotion

Melodrama - Homework Task 3: Costume Design

Choose one character from your Melodrama (Either Hector, Rosilinda, Lord Byron or the Father). Design their costume for a Victorian Melodrama performance adding <u>full colour</u> and as much detail as you can.





This task asks you to look at Victorian costumes online and use this to gain inspiration for your design. You may want to type in: Victorian Melodrama Costumes – into Google Images and have a look at the results to get ideas. Above is a picture of a design from an S1 pupil – this is an example of good work.

You should then add colour to enhance your design - pencils are best for showing detail.

Then add:

- props e.g. a parasol for Rosalinda
- accessories e.g. a sword for Hector

- jewellery e.g. a pocket watch for Lord Byron

Love at the Railway Station

<u>Characters</u> Father, Daughter Rosalinda, Evil Lord Byron the Great, Hector the Hero. Love at the Railway Station is the tale of the beautiful Rosalinda and the Evil Lord Byron. Two young lovers Hector and Rosalinda are sitting on a bench at the railway station. Enter the Girl's father.

Father - How dare you! Get away from my daughter!

Hector - But sir | wish to marry your daughter!

Father - She is promised to another and you young man, are poor and he is very, very rich!

Rosalínda - Oh no you don't mean Lord Byron do you?

Father - Yes my dear. Lord Byron the Great!

Rosalinda - Oh no!

Rosalínda faints Hector helps her up onto the bench.

Hector - Don't worry my love. I will leave this place, go find fame and fortune and return to claim you as my bride!

Rosalinda - Oh my brave Hector!

Hector - Farewell for now.

Hector leaves and Rosalinda starts to cry and her father consoles her.

The Lord enters and speaks to the audience.

Lord – It will be too late! I am going to have the hand of the fair Rosalinda. Her father has promised otherwise I will throw them out onto the streets to starve. My rent is many months overdue.

Father - Lord Byron what are you doing here?

Rosalinda - Oh No!

She faints and her father helps her up.

Lord - Rosalinda | have come for you. You are destined to be my wife!

Rosalinda - I would rather die than be your wife!

Lord - That can be arranged!

Father - My daughter you will do as you are told. You will marry Lord Byron or get out of this place and never darken my door again.

Rosalinda - Never!

Lord - Father, let's share a drink from this bottle to seal our arrangement!

Father takes bottle from Lord and drinks.

Lord - Little does he know I have put a poison in that bottle and soon he will be asleep and I can carry him to the railway line! (Evil laugh)

The father begins to choke and falls to the ground. Rosilinda falls to her knees.

Rosalinda - Please let my father go!

The Lord grabs Rosalinda and shakes her.

Lord - The six fifteen is almost due marry me or your father dies!

Enter Hector pointing his sword at the Lord.

Hector - Unhand that woman!

The Lord drops Rosalinda to the ground and draws his sword. The pair fight to the death.

Hector the Hero stabs the Lord through the heart. He is dead.

Hector - So perish all such evil men

Rosalinda – My hero

They hug

Hector - My darling you are mine at last!

The Father comes round, stands up and notices the Evil Lord is dead!

Father - Hector, you have won the hand of the fair Rosalinda. You sir may marry my daughter.

Tips for Improving a Performance

- Face the audience
- Sustain your character
- Learn your lines
- Change your voice and movement to be the character
- Concentrate during rehearsals
- Listen to the other members of your group during rehearsals
