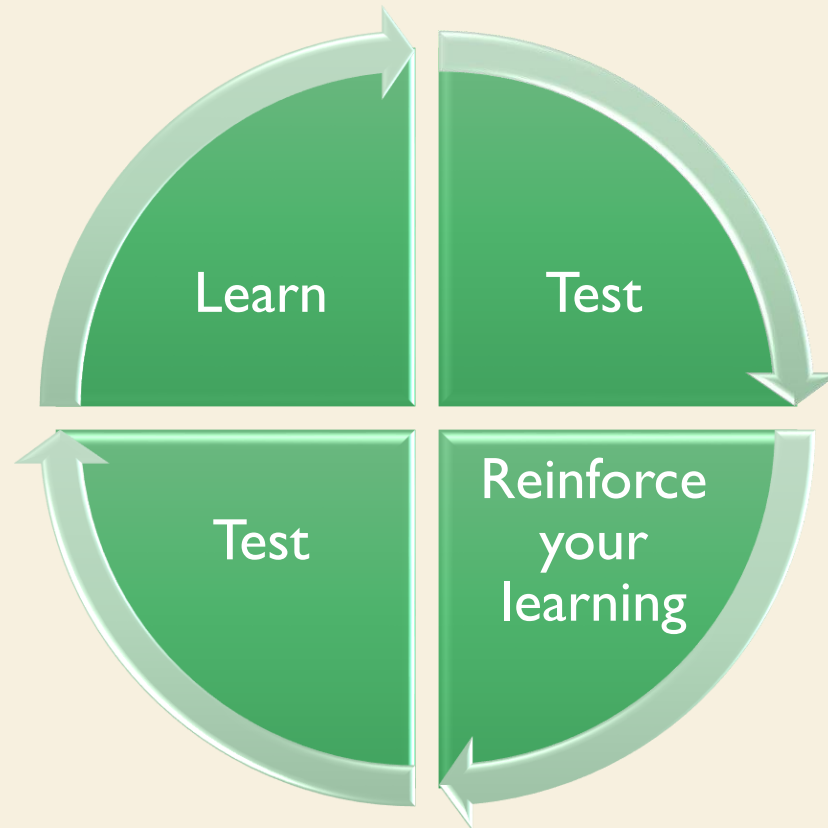

HOW TO LEARN

- Using your notes wisely.
 - DO NOT JUST COPY NOTES WORD FOR WORD!
 - If you must, rewrite in your own words or summarise.
 - Highlight, but don't highlight **every word**.



HOW TO LEARN

- Key words. Learn your vocabulary.
 - Make your own Flash cards
 - Write out a Glossary of terms
- Draw mind maps – organising your thoughts helps to store it in your memory. You can also categorise your flashcards for the same effect.
- Draw diagrams – this suits particular subjects and topics better, but sometimes a picture is easier to remember than words on a page.
- Use post-it notes to write key facts or diagrams and stick in places you visit regularly (wardrobe doors, mirrors). You will read them more often and take them in.

USEFUL WEBSITES

- Quizlet – flashcards and quizzes
- GoConqr – flashcards, mindmaps, quizzes, flowcharts

HOW TO TEST

- Use flashcards to test your recall
- Chop up your glossary and match words with their definitions.
- Print out diagrams and make jigsaws. (better yet, get someone else to cut off all the labels!)
- With a partner try some simple games – taboo, charades, tell me about...
- Try teaching someone else about the topic.
- Finally, test the **application** of your knowledge to exam style questions using past papers.
- Use time limits to add pressure to your revision.
