What are the minimum needed at end of \$5 or \$6?

Check what each faculty accepts as a Science e.g. Maths/ Geography?

• Some universities will offer places very early – pupils get anxious because they haven't finished their form and don't have an offer! – Places are not issued on a first come first served basis

## Interview or Supplementary Testing

Many courses now interview

Mock interviews available – plan ahead, pupils should see Ms Robertson to arrange this
