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Moving Forward The Senior Phase

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<u>S</u>4

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- Reducing to 7 qualifications
 (6 academic/1 wider achievement)
- Core subjects continue
- Most will begin 2 year courses
- Some will follow a combination of 1 year and 2 year courses
- Those on 2 year "H" courses will sit "N5" on route
- Course choices by S3 mid March

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Learner journey - Brian

 Brian is recommended for Higher in 6 or more subjects

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- He chooses 6 Highers across S4 and S5 sitting National 5 exams at the end of S4
- In S6 Brian will sit 2 further Highers
- He will complete his timetable with Hospitality and 1 Advanced Higher

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Brian - Alternative

- Brian is recommended for Higher in 6 or more subjects
- He chooses 6 Highers across S4 and S5
- In S6 Brian will sit 3 Advanced Highers plus one other


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6 Highers example



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Learner journey - Niel

- Niel has been recommended for National 4 or National 5 in his subjects
- He will choose the subjects he is strongest in and be presented for either National 4 or 5 at the end of S4
- He will choose new subjects at the end of S4.
- He might continue with English into National 5 after completing National 4 in S4
- In S5 Niel could also access the EDC vocational programme.

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Niel - Alternative


- Niel has been recommended for National 4 or National 5 in his subjects
- He will choose new subjects at the end of S4.
- In S5 Niel could also access the EDC vocational programme.
- In S6 Niel will study 3 of the subjects he has so far attained National 5 in at Higher level this will be 6 periods per week over 1 year. He will have a further course of study.

- In S6 Fiona will take on further Highers from the subjects she has National 5 in and access the EDC vocational programme


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Combination example

- Aim is for every pupil to achieve their potential.


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Improving attainment for all

Average Total Tariff Points


2016 (S5)

2017 (S5)




Average Total Tariff Points

2018 (S5)



1. Development of more vocational courses

Retailing – Now in its third year and 100% pass rate.

- 5. SRU School of Rugby and a pathfinder school for Character Education.

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
